

8. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated at will, by either Party, with or without cause. Termination shall be by written notice to the other party by U.S. mail or by e-mail so long as there is confirmation of receipt. Notice of termination by either party shall be effective upon the date of receipt. However, neither party may nullify obligations to deliver services or to make payment for services prior to the date of termination. If notified of termination, the District shall cease performing services upon the effective date of termination. If the Village terminates this contract prior to a payment date the village shall remain liable for payment of a pro- rated portion of the contract amount. If the District terminates this contract it shall refund a prorated portion of the contract sum based upon days of service delivered compared to the pro- rated amount paid prior to the date of termination. In no event shall termination nullify obligations of either party prior to the effective date of termination.

9. Severability. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction finds that any term or provision of this Agreement is void, or otherwise unenforceable, all other terms and provisions shall remain intact and enforceable where not otherwise inconsistent with the Court's findings.

10. Scope of Agreement. This Agreement incorporates all of the agreements and understandings between the parties. No prior agreement(s) or understanding(s), verbal or otherwise, shall be valid or enforceable unless embodied in this contract.


11. Amendment(s) to this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be altered, changed, modified or amended, except by instrument, in writing, executed by both parties.

12. Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be governed by the Laws of the State of New Mexico and the resolutions, rules and regulations of the District. Any legal proceeding brought against the District, arising out of this contract, shall be brought before the First Judicial District Court, Santa Fe County, State of New Mexico.


13. Illegal Acts. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 13-1-191, it shall be unlawful for either party to engage in bribery, offering gratuities with the intent to solicit business, or offering or accepting kickbacks of any kind. All other similar act(s) of bribes, gratuities and/or kickbacks are likewise hereby prohibited.

CAN THIS ITEM BE RESCHEDULED: Not recommended

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this MOU is to improve efficiency of the Court and Police Department by Allowing a Motion to Dismiss. This will foster judicial economy whereby certain charges on cases can be dismissed if certain conditions are met, so-called "Fix-it Tickets."

Persons appearing before the Court on the charges listed on the MOU can have their cases dismissed upon fulfillment of certain requirements, usually obtaining the necessary documentation or making the necessary repairs.

This means cases can be closed with the dismissal of charges rather than the case being set for pretrial conference or trial, saving Village officers from having to go to court.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of entering into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Taos County Magistrate Court.

**Memorandum of Understanding
Motion to Dismiss Charges on Officer's Motion**

This document shall serve as an agreement between the Taos Ski Valley Police Department, Chief Sammy Trujillo and Officers under his Commission, and the Taos Magistrate Court Judges Ernest Ortega and Jeffrey Shannon and clerks under their authority.

Effective date: February 21, 2019, In an effort to improve efficiency for both Taos Ski Valley Police Department and Taos County Magistrate Court both agencies will participate in a Memorandum of Understanding allowing Taos Magistrate Court Judges Ernest Ortega, Jeffrey Shannon or other assigned Magistrate Judge to dismiss the following charges without the Chief or Officers having to be present if a defendant in each case meets the criteria set forth below:

- **No Insurance 66-5-205 or 66-5-229** – Defendant shows proof to the Court that valid insurance has been obtained and is now current, or was current at the time of the citation, for the vehicle listed on the citation.
- **No Registration 66-3-1; Expired Registration 66-3-18(b)(c) or 66-3-19; Registration on Demand 66-3-13; and Improper display of Registration 66-3-18(a)**- Defendant shows proof to the Court that valid registration has been obtained and is now current, or was current at the time of the citation, for the vehicle listed on the citation.
- **Driver to Be Licensed 66-5-2; Licenses to be carried 66-5-16**- Defendant shows proof to the Court that valid driver's license has been obtained, or shows proof that the license was valid at the time of the citation was issued.

- **Sun Screen Material on Windows 66-3-846.1-** Defendant shows proof of removal.
- **Head lamps 66-3-804; Tail Lamps 66-3-805-** Defendant shows proof of repair.
- **Windshields 66-3-846-** Defendant shows proof of repair.
- **Possession of under one (1) ounce of marijuana; 30-31-23(B)-** Defendant shows proof of valid Medical Marijuana card

The only exception to this Motion shall be a notation in the Essential Facts section of the Uniform Traffic Citation stating one of the following: "SET FOR TRIAL"; the individual charge is a repeat offender; or the infraction(s) is part of a criminal investigation or a Driving Under the Influence charge under NMSA 66-8-102 violation or connected to another more serious case.

This Motion and MOU is signed on behalf of all Law Enforcement Officers employed by the Village of Taos Ski Valley Police Department assigned to all duties within the Village of Taos Ski Valley in Taos County, State of New Mexico.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Village of Taos Ski Valley Ordinance 17-30 currently allows for an unspecified review process that could involve review and comment from department and other professional subject matter experts. In order to establish a consistent process and reduce reliance on administrative prerogative, a resolution calling for a departmental team review is proposed for development projects. The current process may have a series of conversations, meetings, interpretations, agreements and decisions that may or may not be included in the official record. While the TIDD projects specifically require Village oversight and approval, the Development Review Team Process is intended for development review of future land use development and construction projects in the Village. This process is used in other municipalities to get a consistent, efficient review and oversight, approval of construction projects.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends approval of establishing a formal Development Review Team process under Ordinance 17-30, by the adoption of **Resolution No. 2019-386**.

**VILLAGE OF TAOS SKI VALLEY
RESOLUTION NO. 2019-386**

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 17-30, Sections 2 - 4 call for protection of the public health and safety, through scrutiny and encouragement of orderly development;

WHEREAS, the Village desires that all land use and development projects receive Development Team Review as deemed necessary by Village staff to insure conformity to Village Ordinances and Land Use Regulations;

WHEREAS, the Village of Taos Ski Valley Tax Increment Development District (TIDD) was formed on July 1, 2015;

WHEREAS, the TIDD was created pursuant to New Mexico's Tax Increment Development Act, Sections 5-15-1 through 5-15-28, NMSA 1978, in order to finance the public infrastructure necessary to support the current and future development of the Village of Taos Ski Valley (VTSV, the "Village");

WHEREAS, as part of the TIDD, the Taos Ski Valley, Inc., a New Mexico Corporation ("TSV, Inc."), as agent for Twining Development LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Twining"), and Santander Holdings, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Santander") and their respective successors, assigns and designees, have submitted to the Village of Taos Ski Valley (the "Village") a Plan for the revitalization of the Village (the "Plan") through the redevelopment of portions thereof, the construction of roadway, pedestrian, river crossing, water, wastewater and other utility improvements and upgrades necessary to support future development of the Village (the "public infrastructure projects");

WHEREAS, the public infrastructure projects are designed to reasonably protect the interests of the Village in meeting its goals to support: (1) job creation, (2) economic development, and (3) the long-term sustainability of public infrastructure serving the Village;

WHEREAS, In accordance with the Master Development Agreement between TVSI, VTSV and TIDD Section 4. A.; The Village shall have the right to review any construction documents prior to any construction, to ensure each component is constructed in conformity to all Village regulations and codes and that the cost of these is reasonably consistent with the **(Exhibit C)** estimated costs in the Updated Plan of Finance;

WHEREAS, the Village has the right to request reasonable adjustments to and comment on Construction Documents submitted for its review by TSVI and the Village desires to create a **Development Review Team** process for ensuring that it has adequate oversight of the public infrastructure projects during design and construction phases, and prior to their final conveyance and acceptance by the Village;

WHEREAS, the Plan provides that TSVI will construct certain public infrastructure projects, which upon completion and acceptance of the work, will be conveyed to and assumed by the Village for ongoing operation and maintenance;

WHEREAS, upon acceptance of the reviewed public infrastructure projects as belonging to the Village, the Village and its taxpayers are responsible for the ongoing costs of upkeep and maintenance;

WHEREAS, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE VILLAGE OF TAOS SKI VALLEY AS FOLLOWS:

1. The process by the Development Review Team shall require that each project meet all federal, state and local laws, including land use regulations and building codes and conform to the adopted Village Comprehensive Plan and other officially adopted planning documents
2. At the initiation of each development application and construction project and pursuant to Ordinance, the Plan and the Master Development Agreement, the Village Administrator, working in conjunction with Village staff including: the Planning & Community Development Director, the Building Inspector, the Public Works Director and assigned invited reviewers shall; conduct a review process for development and construction projects to confirm all application components to be permitted, inspected, approved and "signed-off" internally by the Village, have been submitted and completed.
3. The Development Review Team will support experienced Village personnel in working closely with developers, as well as all project architects, engineers, contractors and subcontractors, to ensure the quality of the work and timely completion of all projects.
4. The Date and Time of the Development Review Team meetings will be established by the Village Administrator or designee.
5. The Village's oversight, as set forth herein, will not result in the Village assuming liability for construction.
