The landowner will allow New Mexico Forestry Division, its representatives, and contractors access to the property for the purposes of project implementation and inspection. (Permission for access will be requested prior to entry.) Landowners shall clearly identify property boundaries, fence lines, maintain ingress/egress, reseed disturbed areas as applicable to control or limit erosion, and remove fuel wood within the project area. Consider the following as they apply to your property and situation: maintain fences, re-seed where applicable to control erosion, maintain defensible space and fuel loading with periodic cutting, mowing, clearing, and proper slash disposal/treatment. Move fuelwood piles 30 feet away from home; mow, rake, remove vegetation, needles and litter around structures; mow and remove grass, brush, and debris around liquid propane tank. Install spark arrestors on chimney and maintain ample ingress/egress for firefighting equipment and apparatus. This defensible space or hazardous fuel reduction project shall be maintained by landowners for 10 years.*
