STAGE 2 FIRE RESTRICTIONS



ONLY YOU CAN PREVENT WILDFIRES

Fires, Campfires, and Stove Fires



PROHIBITED: Building, maintaining, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove

Propane and Liquid Petroleum Devices



PERMITTED: Persons using a device solely fueled by liquid petroleum or liquified petroleum gas (LPG) fuels that can be turned on and off. Such devices can only be used in an area that is barren or cleared of all overhead and surrounding flammable materials within 3 feet of the device.



Vehicles

PROHIBITED: Possessing or using a motor vehicle off National Forest System roads unless solely for the purpose of parking in an area that is devoid of vegetation within 10 feet of the roadway.



Explosives

ALWAYS PROHIBITED: Using explosives, including fireworks, flares, exploding targets, or other incendiary devices.



Smoking

PROHIBITED: Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, building, or developed recreation site.

Chainsaws



PROHIBITED: Operating a chainsaw or other equipment powered by an internal combustion engine between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Welding



PROHIBITED: Welding or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame.
